



Fishing Regulations for Hand-Held Gear and Trolling

This is a summary of the regulations. It does not apply to crayfish fishing or any type of fishing other than angling with hand-held gear and trolling. The full regulations are available in Swedish on the association's website and must be read before fishing begins. Violation of the fishing regulations may result in a fine being issued!

General Rules

- A maximum of two hand-held fishing rods may be used per fishing permit/fishing rights certificate.
- A maximum of four rods may be used per boat when trolling.
- A maximum of two (2) salmonid fish (trout, etc.) may be caught per day and per fishing permit/fishing rights certificate.
- Minimum size for trout is 50 cm. Maximum size for perch is 40 cm, and for pike 100 cm, measured from the tip of the snout to the outermost point of the tail fin.
- All carp species (common carp, mirror carp, etc.) and grass carp must be released.
- To engage in fishing, a valid fishing permit/fishing rights certificate and valid identification must be carried and shown upon request by the police or a fisheries officer. The fishing permit must be signed in permanent ink by the angler, who must also have read and acknowledged the current fishing regulations.
- Fishing permits are personal and non-transferable.
- Fishing for commercial sale is prohibited. Exceptions apply for bream, ide, and roach when sold as bait fish.
- Fish or crayfish used as bait must be caught within the Rämshyttan Fisheries Management Area to prevent the spread of fish diseases.
- Using shrimp or other marine crustaceans, fish, molluscs, or shellfish as bait is prohibited to prevent the spread of fish diseases.
- A special fishing permit or fishing rights certificate is required for fishing in Mörtsjön and the Småsjöarna lakes.

Protected Areas and Closed Seasons

- During the period 15 September to 31 December, fishing in flowing waters is prohibited:
- In Flokån/Lugnån/Krischerboån between Sångens and the main road, only fly fishing is permitted, and all trout caught must be released regardless of size. Only catch-and-release fishing is allowed.
 - Fishing is prohibited in the dam area at the outlet of Lake Råmen from 1 January until ice break-up, due to danger associated with lake regulation. (Note: Lilla Laxsjön is not part of the fisheries management area.)
 - Fishing is completely prohibited all year in Krischerboån/Flokån in the area between Highway 50 and the river's outlet into Tunsnäs-Långsjön.
 - During the period 1 September to 30 November, fishing is prohibited in Kvarndammen at Krischerbo as well as in Tunsnäs-Långsjön within 200 meters of the mouth of Krischerboån/Flokån.
 - Holding a fishing permit or fishing rights certificate does not grant the right to fish in the waters listed below where fishing is prohibited:
 1. The dam area at the outlet of Lake Råmen during the period 1 January to 30 April, due to danger associated with lake regulation.
 2. Spånsån, between St Spånsån and Gomen.
 3. Storån, between Gomen and Hästbergs Flatnan.
 4. Flokån/Lugnån/Krischerboån, between the main road and Tunsnäs-Långsjön.
 5. Hyttbäcken, between Sångdammen in Laxsjön and Laxsjö Flatnan.
